

In 1965, Franklin Warren arrives in Vermont, as a police detective. He's barely unpacked when he's called to a remote farm where a man seems to have set fire to his barn and himself. But things aren't adding up. People have secrets.
- *An Eye For An Eye*—Jeffrey Archer

Living in the home he inherited from his mother, painter and construction worker Cash has never known anything beyond the fields of WI. But when Rose blows into town, everything changes. It's love at first sight. For Cash, anyway.
- *The Borrowed Life of Frederick Fife*—Anna Johnston. Fred was born with an extra helping of kindness in his heart. At 82, he's desperately lonely, broke and homeless. In a bizarre case of mistaken identity, he takes Bernard's place at the local nursing home. Now he has a roof over his head, three meals a day, and the chance to be part of a family again. He hopes his poker face is in better shape than his prostate and that his look-alike never turns up. As Fred navigates life in Bernard's shoes, he learns about the man's past and what it might take to return a life in better condition than he found it.

- *Farewell To Arfs: a Chet & Bernie mystery*—Spencer Quinn. Chet the dog and his partner PI Bernie Little's neighbor, Mr. Parsons, loaned his ne'er do well son, Billy, some money to help get himself settled. But days later, Mr. Parsons discovered that his entire life savings is gone. It's up to Chet and Bernie to track Billy down and get to the bottom of things before it's too late.

- *Fire In The Sky*—Sophie Jordan.
Treated as part of the royal family but also as the lowliest servant, Tamsyn fits nowhere. To save the a pampered princesses from a fate worse than death, Tamsyn is commanded to marry the Beast of the Borderlands. Rather than start a war, Fell accepts Tamsyn as his bride. But can he accept the dark secrets she harbors, secrets buried so deep even she doesn't know they exist? Tamsyn is more than a royal whipping girl, more than the false wife of a man who sees her as his enemy. Magic is not dead, it is only sleeping. And it will take one ordinary girl with an extraordinary destiny to awaken it.

A group of employees and their CEO crash onto a not-quite-deserted tropical island. Those who survive find a fully-stocked private palace with the latest technological updates (though one without connection to the outside world). The house has secrets and a dark reason for being built & abandoned.
- *Grave In The Woods*—Martin Walker
- *Hard Winter: Montana Yesterday & Today*—William Johnstone
- *Haunted*—Kat Martin. 1898: in the mining city of Jerome, AZ., a brutal murder sets the stage for a series of strange events that echo into the future. 2024: A brutal murder at the Copper Star Saloon, and ghostly sightings bring hotel owners, Jenny & Cain, together to solve the mystery. Cain vows not to let anything or anyone living or dead stand between him and the woman he has come to love.
- *Here One Moment*—Liane Moriarty
A woman stands up on a plane, and predicts when everyone will die. The passengers laugh it off until it starts to come true.

- *Hitchcock Hotel*—Stephanie Wrobel
Alfred Smettle is not your average Hitchcock fan. He is the founder, owner, and manager of the Hitchcock Hotel, a sprawling Victorian house in the White Mountains dedicated to the master of suspense. There, Alfred offers his guests round-the-clock film screenings, movie props and memorabilia in every room, plus an aviary with fifty crows. To celebrate the hotel's first anniversary, he invites his former best friends from his college film club for a reunion. He hasn't spoken to any of them in sixteen years, not after what happened. But who better to appreciate Alfred's creation? And to help him finish it. After all, no Hitchcock set is complete without a body.
- *The House At Watch Hill*—Karen Marie Monig. After the sudden death of her mother, Zo Grey receives a call from an attorney in Louisiana with the news she the sole beneficiary of a cousin's huge fortune and a monstrosity of a house. But, she must live in it, alone, for three years before the house, or the money, is hers. The house is full of secrets. What Zo doesn't know is that her own roots lie in this house and in order to discover her true identity and awaken her dormant powers, she will have to face off against sinister forces she doesn't quite comprehend.

Steve is enjoying retired life. He does the odd bit of investigation work, but prefers his familiar routines. His days of adventure are over. Adrenaline is daughter-in-law Amy's business. As a private security officer, she's on a remote island keeping a world-famous author alive., which was meant to be an easy job. Then a dead body, a bag of money and a killer have Amy sending an SOS to the only person she trusts. A race around the world begins, but can Amy and Steve stay one step ahead of a lethal enemy?

- **Arachnophobia:** A doctor, deathly afraid of spiders, moves his family to a town where the disgusting arachnids are attacking the townspeople. He must overcome his fear to save the community, but it may be too late!
- **Bell, Book & Candle:** A witch casts a spell to make a mortal fall in love with her.
- **Beetle Juice:** After Barbara and Adam Maitland are killed in a car crash, they are trapped as ghosts in their farmhouse. Their peaceful 'existence' is disrupted when a yuppie family buys their house. The Maitland's are harmless as ghosts and their efforts to scare the Deetz's away are unsuccessful. They call Beetlejuice, a people-exorcizing ghost, for help.
- **Blithe Spirit:** When a novelist suffering from writer's block, in hopes of inspiration, invite an eccentric medium to their house, the séance brings back the novelist's deceased first wife who is ready to pick up her life right where she left off.
- **Casper:** Determined to get her hands on her father's hidden fortune, Carrigan hires an afterlife therapist to exercise the ghosts that keep frightening her away. When Dr. Harvey & Kat move in and meet Casper, the friendly ghost, Casper's uncles are determined to drive all the "fleshies" away.
- **Fun Size:** While taking her little brother trick-or-treating, Wren's brother goes missing and she and her friends must find him before their mom finds out.
- **The Ghost & Mr. Chicken:** when a reporter visits the old Simmon's mansion at midnight, he is certain he sees a ghost. His story makes front page news and brings on a libel suit. When the trial judge orders an investigation and no apparition appears, Luther is branded a fraud until he and his girlfriend team up to uncover the mystery.
- **The Ghost & Mrs. Muir:** At the turn of the century a young widow and her daughter move into a cottage on the English coast which is haunted by the ghost of its former owner, a sea captain. When he finds he can't scare her away, they soon fall into a most unlikely love affair!
- **Ghostbusters:** A group of parapsychologists start a ghost removal service.
- **Goonies:** Two kids find a treasure map just as they're about to lose their house. They and their friends go on a search for the treasure, with trouble from a few ne'er-do-wells.
- **Goosebumps 2: Haunted Halloween :** Two friends find a magical book that brings a ventriloquist's dummy to life.
- **Haunted Mansion:** Jim is a real estate agent trying to find a buyer for a dilapidated old house in New Orleans. When he visits the property before a family vacation, he discovers it's inhabited by 999 ghosts, none of whom are interested in sharing the space. As the spirits make their displeasure known, Jim and his family, with the help of an eccentric medium Madame Leota, try to get the ghosts to leave.
- **Hotel Transylvania** is a unique resort catering to the finest monsters and their families with Dracula as the host.
- **Hocus Pocus:** When 3 wild witches are accidentally conjured up by pranksters, they return from 17th century Salem and set out to cast a spell on the town, but first they must outwit 3 kids and a talking cat.
- **The Invisible:** Nick is brutally attacked and left for dead. But he is really not dead, yet. He is trapped in a ghostly limbo where no one can see or hear him except Annie who may be the one person able to save him. They work together to solve the mystery of his murder before it is too late and Nick's chance to live is lost forever.
- **It:** A group of bullied kids band together when a monster clown begins hunting children.
- **Lego Scooby-Doo!:** Scooby and friends try to save an old movie studio threatened by developers and monsters.
- **ParaNorman:** Norman is a boy who must use his special powers to save his town from a curse. He fights spooky zombies, unpredictable ghosts, wily witches and worst of all, clueless grown-ups. But this young ghoul whisperer will soon find his paranormal activities pushed to their otherworldly limits.
- **Portrait of Jenny:** An artist meets a girl in Central Park who has a mysterious air about her. What follows is an unforgettable love story.
- **Something Wicked This Way Comes:** Terrible things happen when the Pandemonium Carnival comes to town.
- **Trick or Treat Scooby-Doo!** Scooby and his pals have to save Halloween from menacing foes.
- **The Turn of the Screw:** A naïve young governess is hired by a charming bachelor to look after his two children.
