
New DVDs

How To Add Other Content Groups To Your SDL Libby Account

Log into your Libby account and select "Menu" (the center button) on the toolbar at the bottom of the screen.

- 1. Under "Your Libraries" click "Add Library"
- 2. In the text box asking for Library Name begin typing the name of one of the above content groups
- 3. Click on the library card icon next to the name of the content group you wish to add to your account
- 4. Click "Sign In With My Card"
- 5. Click on Sanilac District Library
- 6. Enter your library card number and PIN. Click "Sign In"
- 7. Repeat steps 1 6 until each Content Group is added.
- 8. Content groups only have to added to your account *one time*. Once added, Libby automatically searches all the Content Groups in your account.
