

Adult Programs such as arts & crafts, cooking, gardening, music and more!

Book Sale: a selection of audio books, books in print and DVDs will be available "for sale" by donation.

Children's Programs: Baby Time, Toddler Time, Summer Story Time, STREAM Club (Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Art & Music), LEGO Club and more begin in June.

Library of Things (LOTs): Patrons will be able to borrow useful items such as cake pans, cookware, craft supplies, crock pot, games, puzzles, sports equipment, tools, toys and more. LOTs will open as soon as "Things" are acquired.

Movies: SDL is scheduling a monthly family movie night. The date and time may be adjusted as audience preference is determined. Summer matinees may be offered.
