- •An Amateur Sleuth's Guide To Murder: A Bainbridge Island Mystery Lynn Cahoon. Meg doesn't just solve crimes, she writes about how to do it . . .
- •Atmosphere—Taylor Jenkins Reid Joan has always been obsessed with the stars. Content as a professor until she sees an ad seeking women scientists to join NASA's space shuttle program. Joan burns to be one of the few people to go to space.
- •Beach Reads and Deadly Deeds—Allison Brennan. Strange notes in a book draw her a bibliophile into a real-life investigation.
- •Beacon In The Night—David Lewis 1941: London endured the relentless bombing campaign of the Blitz and emerged, scarred but unbroken. Now the war has entered another phase. Instead of indiscriminate bombing, the Luftwaffe pinpoints cathedrals and ancestral homes and then hospitals and nursing homes are under attack too. As a member of the female 512 counterespionage unit, Caitrin is tasked with rooting out saboteurs who are placing the homing beacons.
