- *Beyond The Wire: a novel of Auschwitz*—James Shipman. Jakub toils under the scrutiny of SS guards sorting through the clothes of the dead and moving their bodies from the gas chambers to the crematoriums. Every morning, Anna and other prisoners are forced to work in a munitions factory. Some of the women are smuggling trace amounts of gunpowder back to the camp in a bold plan to liberate the camp.
- *Brown Girls*—Daphne Andreades. Growing up in Queens, Nadira, Mae, Trish, and Aisha become friends for life. Together they learn to survive schoolyard bullies, clueless teachers and the leering gaze of men.
- *Bye Bye Baby: a Spencer novel*—Robert B. Parker (Ace Atkins). When an outspoken young congresswoman running for re-election faces numerous death threats, her chief of staff reaches out to Spenser for security and he soon crosses paths with an extremist group called The Minutemen.
- *Desolation Canyon*—P. J. Tracy. LAPD Detective Margaret Nolan makes a grim discovery beneath the surface of Swan Lake: the body of an attorney who made his fortune in international trade. As a series of shocking revelations emerge, Nolan finds herself confronting a sinister cabal that just might destroy her and everyone she loves.
- *Disappearance Of A Scribe*—Dana Stabenow. After two Alexandrian fishermen discover a skeleton anchored by a cement weight, Queen Cleopatra charges Tetisheri, her new Eye of Isis, to uncover the identities of the victim and the killers.
- *Easter Bonnet Murder: a Lucy Stone Mystery*—Leslie Meier
- *End Of Days: a Pike Logan novel*—Brad Taylor
- *The Ex-Husband*—Karen Hamilton. Former con artist Charlotte becomes trapped with someone who knows her past and is hell-bent on making her pay for it.
- *The Family You Make*—Jill Shalvis. Pretending to be the girlfriend of Levi Cutler for just one family dinner, Jane, after a series of events and new friends cause them to spend more time together, wonders if this is the life she was always meant to have.
- *The Fields*—Erin Young. A woman found dead in an Iowa cornfield, one of the few farms still managing to compete with the giants of Big Agriculture. When Sergeant Riley Fisher, newly promoted to head of investigations, arrives on the scene, a horrific crime becomes personal when she discovers the victim was a childhood friend, connected to a dark past she thought she'd left behind.
- *The Good Son*—Jacquelyn Mitchard. When her son is released from prison, Thea is committed to helping him make amends until attempts on their lives are made.

- *The Good Wife of Bath*—Karen Brooks. In 1364 England, one of literature's most unforgettable characters, Chaucer's *Wife of Bath*, tells her story in her own words as she rises through society from a cast-off farm girl to a woman of fortune fighting to control her own life.
- *The High House*—Jessie Green-grass. Trying to make a home in the midst of an environmental disaster, Caro, her younger brother and High House's caretaker and his granddaughter fight to stay alive as the rising waters threaten to engulf the whole town.
- *I Must Betray You*—Ruta Sepetys. In a country governed by isolation, fear and a tyrannical dictator, Cristian is blackmailed by the secret police to become an informer, but he decides to use his position to try to outwit his handler, undermine the regime, give voice to fellow Romanians, and expose to the world what is happening in his country. (This book is in the YA section)
- *In Five Years*—Rebecca Serle. Dannie is on track for her 5 year plan when she lands her ultimate job. That night she dreams herself 5 years in the future. She buries herself in work until she meets the man from her dream and her plan starts to unravel.
- *Just Like the Other Girls*—Claire Douglas. After the death of her mother, Una becomes a ladies' companion. She discovers that the two companions before her disappeared, never to be seen again.
- *Life Flight: Extreme Measures #1*—Lynette Eason. Helicopter pilot Penny Carlton is used to stress, but an emergency landing in a raging storm with a critical patient on board would test the limits of the best of pilots.
- *Lightning In A Mirror*—Jayne Krentz
- *Love At First Spite*—Anna Collins
- *A More Perfect Union*—Tammye Huf. When Henry O'Toole escapes the Irish famine and sails to America, he doesn't expect the prejudice. Determined to never starve again, he changes his name to Henry Taylor to secure a job. Travelling south, he meets Sarah, a slave woman torn from her family and sold. In 1849, interracial marriage is considered an illegal abomination. No matter how much they want to be together, Sarah is trapped on Jubilee Plantation and owned by another man.
- *The Night Train To Berlin*—Melanie Hudson. June 1944, Ellie, a shy violinist meets Joe, a fellow passenger, who makes her feel like she has been given a second chance.
- *One Step Too Far*—Lisa Gardner

True crime writer Wylie Lark, snowed in at an isolated farmhouse where she's retreated to write her new book, finds a small child in the snow outside and, bringing him inside for warmth and safety, learns that the farmhouse isn't as isolated as she thought.

Magda secretly joins The White Rose Movement. When an English pilot crashes near Magda's home she is faced with an impossible choice: to risk the safety of her family or to save a stranger.
- *A Stranger's Game*—Colleen Coble. A wealthy hotel heiress. A suspicious death. A fight for the truth
- *Targeted: a Bob Lee Swagger novel*—Stephen Hunter. After being accused of reckless endangerment and forced to answer to the U.S. Congress, master sniper Bob Lee Swagger must protect political hostages in a once-in-a-lifetime standoff.
