Use your SDL card to redeem passes to hundreds of art, cultural and historical institutions, plus recreational areas, State Parks and tourist attractions. Free or reduced admission, discounts to gift shops or other exclusive offers are available from MAP.

New destinations are always being added.

SDL card holders may print a free one-day pass to any of Michigan's 102 state parks or 138 state forest campgrounds from your own device or at the library. Last year, the MAP program returned \$50,000 in value to over 10,000 patrons who used their library card for admission to a featured site.
