- •Beans, Bourbon and Blood: A Luke Jensen-Dewey McKenzie western— William Johnstone
- •Camino Ghosts—John Grisham. Bookseller Bruce Cable tells Mercer Mann an irresistible tale that might inspire her next novel. A resort developer is using political muscle to claim ownership of a deserted island. Only the last living inhabitant of the island stands in the way. The developer doesn't know that the island has a remarkable history and locals believe it is cursed.
- •Clete: a Dave Robicheaux novel— James Lee Burke
- •The Comfort of Ghosts: a Maisie Dobbs novel—Jacqueline Winspear. London, 1945: 4 teen orphans with a dark wartime history are squatting in a vacant mansion whose owner had fled during the bombing of London. Maisie is puzzled by teens stories and they mysteriously, they possess self-defense skills one might expect of trained adults in wartime. Her quest to bring comfort and the promise of a future to the youngsters brings to light a decades-old mystery concerning Maisie's first husband, who was killed while piloting an experimental aircraft. This final assignment of her own choosing opens a new future for Maisie and her family.

Born into the Jewish elite in Warsaw, Lena's family was destroyed by the Nazis. Determined to fight against Nazi rule, she acts as a spy on the Aryan side fearlessly protecting the remaining Warsaw Jews.





- 2) Enter your 14 digit library card number.
- 3) Enter your PIN (your last name in lower case letters).

How To Add Other Content Groups To Your SDL Libby Account

Log into your Libby account and select "Menu" (the center button) on the toolbar at the

- 1. Under "Your Libraries" click "Add Library"
- 2. In the text box asking for Library Name begin typing the name of one of the above con-
- 3. Click on the library card icon next to the name of the content group you wish to add to your account
- 4. Click "Sign In With My Card"
- 5. Click on Sanilac District Library
- 6. Enter your library card number and PIN. Click "Sign In"
- 7. Repeat steps 1 6 until each Content Group is added.
- 8. Content groups only have to added to your account one time. Once added, Libby automatically searches all the Content Groups in your account.
