- *Ashton Hall*—Lauren Belfer. Coping with her husband's betrayal, Hannah moves into Ashton Hall with her son and tries to discover more about the remains of a woman walled into a forgotten part of the manor.
- *Aurora*—David Koeppe. When a solar storm knocks out power across the globe, Aubrey, in Aurora, Illinois, becomes the fierce protector of her neighborhood, while across the country, her brother hunkers down in his gilded desert bunker, leading to a long-overdue reckoning between siblings.
- *The Beach Trap*—Ali Brady. When 12-year-old Kat and Blake meet at camp, they become instant best friends until they learn they are also half-sisters. 15 years later when their father dies, they inherit the family beach house in FL. Blake's renovation plans conflict with Kat's creative vision. The most difficult project they face will be learning how to become sisters.
- *A Botanist' Guide to Parties and Poisons: Saffron Everleigh mystery*—Kate Khavari. Attempting to blaze a new trail for women at the University College London in 1923, research assistant Saffron becomes involved in solving the murder of a professor's wife who was poisoned at a school dinner party.
- *December '41: a WWII thriller*—William Martin. On the day after Pearl Harbor, shocked Americans gather around their radios to hear FDR declare war. In L A, a German agent plans to kill FDR on the night he lights the National Christmas Tree. Who will stop him?
- *Dreaming Of Flight*—Catherine Hyde. 11-year-old Stewie and his brother have been raised on a farm by their older sister...And every day Stewie goes door to door selling fresh eggs from his wagon--a routine with a surprise just around the corner. It's his new customer, Marilyn. She's prickly and guarded, yet comfortably familiar...Marilyn has a reason for keeping her distance: a secret no one knows about...But whatever difficult times lie ahead, Stewie learns that although he can't fix everything for Marilyn or himself, at least he's no longer alone.
- *Escape: a Billy Harney thriller*—James Patterson
- *A Face To Die For: an Eve Duncan novel*—Iris Johansen
- *The Favor*—Nora Murphy. Leah and McKenna have never met But they will... Their lives have all the trappings of success, wealth and happiness. But both are trapped. Leah understands that what's inside a home can be more dangerous than what's outside. Driving past McKenna's house one night, she sees that McKenna's "perfect" husband is not what he seems. Leah keeps watch over McKenna, until one night, she intervenes.
- *Flying Solo*—Linda Holmes. Laurie returns to her Maine hometown to handle the estate of her great-aunt, a spirited adventurer who lived to be 90. She finds a wooden duck and letter that ends with the line, "if you're ever desperate, there are always ducks, darling." When the duck disappears, she feels compelled to figure out why anyone would steal it and it was hidden in the first place.
- *The Girl With The Make-Believe Husband: a Bridgerton prequel*—Julia Quinn
- *The Girl Who Survived*—Lisa Jackson.
- *Hatchet Island*—Paul Doiron. A call for help from a former colleague leads game warden investigator Mike and his girlfriend Stacey on a sea kayaking trip to a research station far off the Maine coast. With no one to trust and miles from shore, Mike must stop a ruthless murderer.
- *Hotel Nantucket*—Elin Hilderbrand. After a bad breakup, Lizbet is named general manager of the Hotel Nantucket, a Gilded Age gem turned eyesore. While the Hotel appears to be a paradise, there's a lot of drama behind closed doors. In 1922, a tragic fire killed a chambermaid. With Grace gleefully haunting the halls, staff with secrets and Lizbet's romantic uncertainty, is the Hotel destined for success or doom?

How To Access Your SDL Account

Use your account to see the items currently checked out to you, the due dates, renew (one time per item), reserve, set-up reminder notices, view circulation history (items borrowed in the past), make reading lists and more.

1. Go to SDL's website. Click on the CATALOG button.
2. Click **Please Login** in the upper right corner of the blue title bar. A window will appear.
3. Type in your 14 digit barcode number, found on your library card. *Do not type in * asterisks.*
4. The default password is *userpass*. After you login, you are required to make a new password. Remember it! Library staff *do not* have access to your password. If you do forget, library staff are able to reset the password to *userpass*. You must then create a new password.
5. Click **Remember Me** if you are using My Account from home.

Use your SDL card to redeem passes to hundreds of art, cultural and historical institutions plus recreational areas, State Parks and tourist attractions. Free or reduced admission, discounts to gift shops and other exclusive offers are available. New destinations are always being added. SDL card holders may print a free one-day pass to any of Michigan's 102 state parks or 138 state forest campgrounds from your own device or at the library. Last year, the MAP program returned \$50,000 in value to over 10,000 patrons who used their library card for admission to a featured site.

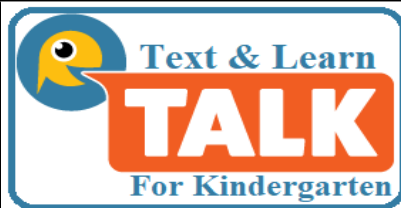

Start your child on the road to learning. TALK activities increase back-and-forth conversations and provide activities for little ones to learn through exploration and discovery.

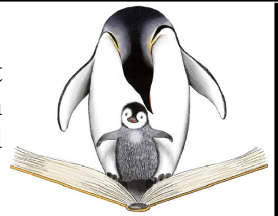
