SDL cardholders in good standing, who live in SDL's legal service area of CPS School District, Sanilac Township and portions of Forester Township have the following benefits:

- Borrow materials from SDL's collection of over 45,000 items.
- Use 'Your Account' in SDL's online catalog: (see directions below)
 - See titles of items currently checked out to you and their due dates
 - Reserve materials
 - Create reading lists
 - Renew items (except movies) one time
 - Set up system generated email reminders
 - View your circulation history
- Use public access computers and WiFi at SDL.
- Print free or reduced price tickets to cultural institutions, recreation areas and tourist attractions participating in MAP: Michigan Activity Pass.
- MeLCat: Borrow materials from other MI libraries & pick them up at SDL.
- Find information in MeL: Michigan Electronic Library databases.
- Download Libby eBooks, audio books and eMagazines to your own device from any location. Click on the icon on SDL's website. Use your 14 digit SDL number and your last name in lower case letters as the PIN. See page 3

How To Access Your SDL Account

1. Go to SDL's website. Click on the CATALOG icon on the right side.
2. Click **Please Login** in the upper right corner of the blue title bar. A new window will appear.
3. Type in your 14 digit barcode number (found on your library card). Do not type in * asterisks.
4. The default password is userpass. After you login, you are required to make a new password. Remember it! Library staff do not have access to your password. But, if you do forget, library staff are able to reset the password to userpass. You must then create a new password.
5. Click **Remember Me** if you are using My Account from home.

Libby accounts have been set-up for all SDL library card holders.



Go to SDL's website and click on the Libby icon to get instructions about how to download and use the Libby App. Access your account:

- 1) Choose SDL as your home library
- 2) Enter your 14 digit library card number
- 3) Enter your PIN (your last name in lower case letters).

Add Other Content Groups To Your SDL Libby Account

Log into your Libby account and select "Menu" (the center button) on the toolbar at the bottom of the screen

1. Under "Your Libraries" click "Add Library"
2. In the text box asking for Library Name, City, or Zip, begin typing the name of one of the above content groups
3. Click on the library card icon next to the name of the content group you wish to add to your account
4. Click "Sign In With My Card"
5. Click on Sanilac District Library
6. Enter your library card number and PIN. Click "Sign In"
7. Repeat steps 1 through 6 until each Content Group is added to your account.

Once linked, these Content Groups will remain in Your Libraries. Click on the Menu button and then click on the Content Group you wish to search. Preference for high demand items will be given to the home library patrons of each Content Group.

Read books to your newborn, infant, and/or toddler. The goal is to read 1,000 books before your precious one starts kindergarten. Does this sound difficult? If you read just 1 book a night, you will read 365 books in a year. That is 730 books in two years and 1,095 books in three years. Most children start kindergarten at 5 years of age, so you have plenty of time. Get started! Reading together is fun and will create lifelong memories.

How To Participate

- Register your child at SDL and get a reading log
- Use the reading log to keep track of the titles of the books that you or anyone else, including siblings, read with your child. This journal will also make a great keepsake for your child.
- After every 100 books have been read, bring the reading log to SDL. We'll place a sticker on the completed sheet and give your child a book to keep. You will receive a reading log for the next 100 books.
- After completing the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Challenge, your child will receive a special t-shirt.
